Institutions serve more than 8.3 million people.




811,500 are in assisted living facilities.



1.3 million are in nursing homes.


The number of nursing-home residents may double by 2030 if current trends continue. Causes for increase in long-term care, include:


Number of older people with physical or cognitive disabilities projected to grow between 2015 and 2065. (6.3 million to 15.7 million).
